Greetings from Executive Director & Board of Trustees Chair

Through much of the first half of the year, conferences and ropes groups remained at a halt due to the rise of yet another Omicron subvariant. Staff pivoted to address capital improvement projects and repairs.

We were fortunate to be able to address much-needed maintenance and improve our facilities and infrastructure to enhance both the visitor and camper experiences. Having a plan to address cyclical maintenance and capital improvements is critical for our continued success. We strive to be responsible fiscal stewards of Gravatt Camp and Conference Center as demonstrated by our employing staff and volunteers to address almost all projects, maintenance, and repairs on the property. Unless projects require a licensed professional such as an electrician, the work is done by staff and volunteers, stretching the impact of your donations.

Summer camp attendance soared to a record 1,254 campers. The previous record was 1,107 campers. We attribute this increase to our caring and dynamic staff and our campers who, because of Covidrelated constraints, seem eager to reconnect with nature. With donor support, 71 youth received full and partial scholarships through our Mac Westmoreland Scholarship fund. A recent camper sums up the experience as "Everyone at Camp Gravatt makes you feel like you are meant to be there no matter who you are. When you are at camp it almost feels like you are in a different world."

The second half of the year brought an abundance of new conference guests and steady day-group business. Despite our ongoing investments in facility and room upgrades, we remain a modest conference and camp facility. It is evident that Gravatt's affordability, superior service, home-style meal service, and hospitality are what keep guests and campers returning each year. Competitive camp and retreat fees cover operating expenses.

As with any other business and non-profit, we contend with continued increases in operating costs. For instance, our camp and conference food costs rose 11%. While this has been Gravatt's strongest financial year to date and that we are operating from a position of strength, as a nonprofit the need for support is still great.

Clearly, Gravatt's success would not be possible without the support of our generous donors and volunteers. Every dollar donated, unless otherwise specified, goes to camper scholarships and facility improvements. We remain committed to serving all members of our community. We are grateful for your continued commitment and appreciate all you do!

2023 brings some exciting plans as we begin planning for our 75th anniversary in 2024. We have plenty of opportunities for those of all ages to get involved. Please contact a staff member if you are interested in learning more about volunteer and donor opportunities. We hope you are inspired by this glimpse into everything that is happening at Gravatt. Improving grounds


This year we began work with a forestry consultant to update our forestry management plan. This is a long term plan that will guide our work over the next several years to manage and improve forest health and wildlife habitat at Gravatt.

A key technique used to manage our forest is prescribed fire. Prescribed fire reduces wildfire risk, promotes the growth of native trees and plants, and benefits wildlife habitats. Our goal is to use prescribed fire annually in different portions of our forest.

We also have been working to manage our aquatic plant population in Lake Henry with the introduction of 50 sterile grass carp. These carps will eat overgrown patches of aquatic plants and prevent us from having to use a chemical treatment.

The environmental stewardship work we do guides the Gravatt Environmental Education Program (GEEP) for our guests and campers. This ongoing stewardship is an investment in Gravatt's environmental future, enhances guest experiences, and builds more dynamic environmental education programs.

Upgrades and infrastructure

2022 was a great year for maintaining and improving our facilities and infrastructure. Highlights of this year on camp side include new tents installed, road work, and the painting of the Holly Hut and Beckham.

We were just as busy on the conference side of the property including insulation of ductwork in Stewart Hall, new roofing on staff housing and roof repairs of Stewart Hall and the Chapel of Transfiguration, renovation of the office bathroom, and completion of the Grbic Gazebo.

Over the course of several months in early 2022, Gravatt invested in significant upgrades in the water system. Prior to these upgrades, Gravatt had been operating at about 50% water volume and 40% capacity. These upgrades are located in our water distribution center, "the pump house". Upgrades include the installation of two new pumps, new valves, several new gauges to monitor water and water output better, new emergency alert system for low water levels in our tank, and a new and improved electrical and computer system for more effective operations. Together, these improvements significantly enhance the quality of our system in daily operations, monitoring the system, maintenance of our system and much easier and more effective operations for staff. Longtime volunteer and former Gravatt summer staff member, Brian Phillips was instrumental with the replacement and installation of this equipment and training staff to operate the new system. In 2023, our maintenance plans include roof work on the cabins at camp, new maintenance facilities for tools and equipment, and many more projects to come.

We added some new elements such as the Spider's Web and The Acid River. Our high ropes course will only continue to grow as we look ahead to add new and exciting challenges to our course. On the environmental education side, we have been busy learning more about the native plants and animals that call Gravatt home. Currently, we have around 2.25 miles of trails with hopes to expand our trail network to encompass more of the Gravatt property.


Camp Gravatt had an exceptional summer season this year. We welcomed an all-time high of over 1,200 campers during 11 sessions filled with incredible adventure, exploration, and fun.

Campers engaged in traditional activities such as archery, canoeing, and challenge courses. We welcomed new activities this year, such as Survivor Day, Banana Olympics, and a fun Despicable Me Night. Our religious education program, "Footprints," was centered around the theme of storytelling and provided activities such as writing a song or prayer and writing to community organizations such as Prisma Children's Hospital. The summer would not have been complete without our daily visits from Dr. Noid and gathering for Shalom each night.

Along with the exciting activities, the safety of our campers was a top priority. We had over 80 volunteers, and a staff of 40 members (including counselors, support staff, and program directors) ensuring everyone was in safe and fun environments. We provided campers with a unique experience that helped shape their understanding of themselves and how to show love to those around them.

We are thrilled that we have reached capacity for nearly all our sessions in 2023. We look forward to the new memories and experiences that we will create this coming summer and all of the wonderful things we can provide for our campers and community.

As we reflect on 2022 conference bookings, we gained momentum following a very quiet first quarter due to the continued effects of COVID.

Business included conferences/retreats, events, team building, and the Gravatt Environmental

Education Program bookings which accounted for 28% of the annual revenue. Gravatt served 63 groups which accounted for nearly 2,000 guests and 94 nights of overnight stays including eight Episcopal church groups and 12 Diocesan groups.

Investing in Gravat's future

In 1967 additional land was purchased for a youth camp now known as the camp side-Camp Gravatt. Over the years buildings have been built, updated, repurposed to fit the needs of our growing summer camp community and the changing times.

Our most recent additions to the camp side were in 2016 with Byrd Health Lodge and Wood Chaplin's cabin in 2018. The camp side has two structures that hold the entire camp session of campers and staff - Collett Dining Hall and the pavilion. Collett Hall replaced the original camp dining hall in 2002 due to the need for increased functionality.

The camp pavilion has been expanded twice to increase capacity and again we find ourselves at full capacity.






To the right you will see plans for our new camp side pavilion with generous space for continued growth as well as technology that will enable year-round use to accommodate Gravatt's growing leadership and team building, environmental programs, and retreats business. Clint Burdett, long time Gravatt supporter and architect of Collett Hall, is graciously donating his talents to design our new camp side pavilion.

In addition to significantly more camper space, the pavilion will feature a retail store complete with mail room, a walk-up canteen, state of the art sound room, storage, and laundry facility. The pavilion will also include traditional camp games such as ping pong ball, foosball, and four square. Outdoor features will include a year round firepit and lots of covered outdoor areas to relax in a rocker to take in the view of the peaceful pines or visit with a friend.
